Chairperson's Message

LILY Against Human Trafficking Report 2016 covers the years 2014 and 2015.

The highlight was the fantastically successful Arora Ball 2014 hosted by a special couple, Sunita and Surinder Arora. They held it in the beautiful Ballroom of the Arora Sofitel Hotel T5, and top drawer guests and fabulous auction prizes ensured a huge donation to LILY. Their team too worked very hard to make it such a success. Their generosity secures our sheltered homes, livelihood training schemes, medicines and food, for the immediate future. And they did it all with such good grace! Their son, Sanjay, follows closely in their footsteps and is LILY Youth Ambassador.

Lord Rumi Verjee hosted a wonderful reception for us in June 2015 at Thomas Goode, his fabulous Mayfair emporium. We raised funds for Nepal, which was devastated by a major earthquake in April 2015, and Nepalese girls stood an even greater risk of being trafficked from refugee camps. Thanks to Lord Verjee and our supporters, we raised a sizeable sum which now allows us to fund projects on both sides of the border.

Other events included a Youth Reception organized by our Patron Baroness Margaret McDonagh at the House of Lords River Room in June 2014, followed by a tour of the House. Mr Manoj Ladwa supported LILY at his India Inc reception in 2014. In the summer of 2015 Baroness McDonagh arranged tea for some of our supporters at the House of Lords, and they enjoyed the interaction with her.

I am very grateful to all our supporters who have made it possible for us to support fifteen projects: nine in India, four in Nepal and two in the UK, which are all listed in this report. I thank all LILY Committee members, but especially Ms Bina Rani, Ms Heena Vekaria, Mr Kausar Kazmi and Mr Manoj Ladwa; and our Events Committee members Dr Alka Bagri and Ms Anabel Loyd. 

Elina, 22 years, lives in Kokrajhar, Assam. Her family was affected during the communal riots in 2012. Her parents were not able to provide financial support to her and her two younger siblings. Through Lily's support she is now working as a field facilitator with Nedan Foundation. Kokrajhar is a small town, which shares international borders with Nepal, Bangladesh and Bhutan and a state border with West Bengal. Poverty and residing in border towns make girls like Elina highly prone to trafficking.

“ Thanks to LILY, I am proud that I can stand on my own feet. Despite all the hardship we have faced, I am grateful for where I am today. When I look around, there are many who are less fortunate than I am and I feel blessed. I would like to help girls in my village to be more alert and aware of their basic rights. About iPartner India

Our registered UK charity partner is iPartner India (Charity no: 1114944). Bina Rani, founder and CEO of iPartner India, is an integral part of the LILY team, providing invaluable advice and support based on her wide experience.

iPartner India is a not-for-profit that works to make a difference in the complex challenges in social justice and equity issues facing modern India. They enable courageous grassroots organisations to grow to the next level, leading by innovative and sustainable solutions.

Since their inception in 2009, iPartner India has raised and advised on philanthropic activities to the value of £6 million. They have funded over **75 projects** across **17 Indian states**, and their work has impacted over **551,364 vulnerable children, men & women**.

iPartner India provides regular updates, statements of account and yearly audit reports to the LILY Against Human Trafficking.





Partner Organisations - India

Gram Niyojan Kendra (GNK)

Gram Niyojan Kendra works in seven Indian States. LILY supports their project in Bharatpur, Rajasthan where the Bhedia tribe follows the brutal custom of forcing their young girls into prostitution in order to support the male members.

135 students, mostly girls, attend the GNK-run secondary school in Roopwas (Bharatpur) supported by LILY. Without the school, these Bhedia girls would be forced into sex work and sold in the cities.

50 young women and men were trained in computer skills, auto-mechanic, mobile phone repairs, tailoring and beauty salon treatments. They will go on to become micro-entrepreneurs and seek local employment.

Nedan Foundation

Nedan Foundation empowers survivors of trafficking, regional conflict-affected youth and women migrant returnees. Nedan works in the remote villages of Assam to give women and children education and livelihoods opportunities they desperately need.

270 child survivors rescued from national and international traffickers went to school, college and underwent computer training. They were also reunited with their families.

150 women rescued from forced prostitution in cities were repatriated to their villages in Assam. They are now learning traditional weaving, goat rearing, jute fibre harvesting, organic farming and many other local market-oriented skills.

Prerana

Prerana works to end second-generation prostitution. Based out of Kamathipura red light in Mumbai, Prerana provides a safe environment, supports children's education, health and lead advocacy efforts.

Prerana works to break the vicious cycle of a red light district.

4000 children from three red light districts of Mumbai receive education, nutrition and health services. They engage in recreation activities to explore a world beyond the brothel lanes where their mothers work.

LILY supports a place for children to sleep at night, safe and protected, while their mothers' meet with clients.

71% of trafficked victims surveyed by the National Human Rights Commission, India, were illiterate and nearly 50% had a family income of less than \$1 per day

Odanadi

Led by two former journalists, **Odanadi** combats human trafficking, child exploitation and gender-based violence by rescuing, rehabilitating and educating victims. Odanadi enables them to earn a living and reintegrate them back into society.

LILY has helped incubate Manavi Institute of Bakery Management, run by survivors of trafficking. Through this bakery institute, young women who otherwise run a high risk of being trafficked will be provided livelihoods opportunities.

15 women received training from the master baker. Two agencies, a hotel and a yoga ashram, have already committed to procure the bakery-produced goods.





Rahat

Rahat works to assist the most vulnerable women and girls in the poverty-ridden hinterlands of Bihar where many trafficked girls from neighbouring borders of Bangladesh and Nepal reach. Rahat takes on the Border Security Force, police, politicians and the traffickers' mafia to put an end to human trafficking.

Over **50,000 children and young women** were prevented from being illegally smuggled into mainland Indian cities through border crossings.

More than **1000 members of the children's clubs** are under active protection to ensure that they do not go missing, get sold by their families or are kidnapped by traffickers.

20 women survivors have benefited after receiving alternative livelihoods support and are now making a living from their businesses.

500,000 women and children are trafficked every year in India (UNICEF)

STOP

STOP works to counter the violent abuse of girls and women by raiding brothels, providing education and taking legal action. STOP also works with local communities by forming vigilant groups.

200 women formed a Vigilance Group in Bawana slum community, to prevent trafficking. **35,000 girls** are at risk of going missing on a daily basis from the urban slums in Delhi.

The support of LILY ensures that **300 children** are attending school and remain protected. More than **100 adolescent girls** attend vocational training and are ready to earn and take control of their lives.

Vatsalya

Vatsalya works towards breaking the cycle of trafficking by enabling women in sex work to make a bold choice to step out of a life of violence and abuse and retrain in an alternative livelihoods programme. This empowers women to seek their true potential and to live a life with dignity.

LILY'S support enables **100 women** to retrain in alternate livelihoods. This in turn helps to prevent second-generation prostitution for more than **150 children of sex workers**.

LILY also guarantees health care services to **2400 adolescents and children** living around the urban squatters in Jaipur.

Out of the children who continue to remain missing, 35,615 (64%) of them are minor girls

Vishwa Jagriti Mission Trust

Vishwa Jagriti Trust Mission helps poor and vulnerable women and girls. They provide financial support, education and assist in developing their skills so that they can be financially independent and build their self-worth.

100 poor women are receiving eye treatment, including routine testing and surgeries.

LILY is supporting higher education of **20 bright girls** who otherwise would end up getting married even before they turn 18.



Partner Organisations - UK



Helping victims reclaim their lives

Helen Bamber Foundation is a human rights charity working with the most vulnerable and marginalised people from over 90 countries, who have suffered from entrapment, rape and/or torture. Some have been imprisoned; others continue to face threats from traffickers and other perpetrators against themselves and their families.

Support from LILY helped provide medical and therapeutic care, legal protection and day-to-day support to many survivors.



Ensuring the victims receive Justice

Hope for Justice identifies and rescues victims, advocates on their behalf and provides restorative care, which rebuilds lives, and trains frontline professionals to tackle slavery. Their specialist operations team identifies victims and removes them from exploitation, pursues perpetrator accountability and supports survivors.

LILY'S support helped in training, rescue, restoration and advocacy.




